According to [an IBM study](#) by the Ponemon Institute, the average cost of a data breach has grown to \$4 million. The cost per compromised file is \$141 for the

average company and up to \$355 per lost record for more heavily regulated industries, such as healthcare.

That means if you lost one laptop with just 25 files, that would be a loss of over \$3,500 (not counting the computer itself). And let's face it, there are typically hundreds or thousands of files on a single computer.
